HAND DELIVERED

I have been referred to your offices by Constable Eric Gerard of the Richibucto RCMP detachment. This letter is to formally request the intervention of the Sheriff's Office for assistance in order to retrieve and secure my personal property.

In 2007, I made an agreement to purchase a property at 530 St. Augustine Road in Adamsville New Brunswick from Marie Theresa Peters of Elsipogtog First Nation, New Brunswick for \$12,000 CDN. As per our agreement, I began making \$250 monthly payments on the property in 2007; for your information I requested and received copies of these payments and related transaction records from my bank in Florida.

I began residing at 530 St. Augustine Road in Adamsville New Brunswick in 2008, continuing to make these land payments until the final land payment in November 2011. When I assumed the property, the house and lands were in complete disrepair. I proceeded to make the home habitable and the land farm-able and have been living peacefully in the community, where I now have many dear friends and neighbours.

Unfortunately, Mrs. Peters, despite my repeated requests, never provided me with the deed of sale for the property after I had paid in full as per our agreement. To my dismay, she actually re-sold the property to my next door neighbour, who informed me that he was ignoring my claim to the property and that I would not be allowed to enter my home or land retrieve my personal belongings.

On April 8, 2015, I was removed from my home by RCMP without cause or explanation and told that I could not re-enter it, not even to secure my personal property. I have been left homeless and denied access even to my hairbrush, my food, my sacred medicines, my seasonal clothing, my farm animals and my dog. I am currently staying near my home with a friend who is working with others to help me to work these matters out. I understand that the neighbour who "purchased" my property may have been selling or otherwise disposing of my possessions.

For your information, I am disputing these matters and have filed complaints with the parties to this matter and with the RCMP, who advised me yesterday to contact the Sheriff services regarding retrieving my belongings. I am asking your offices for your help.
